Five years after the release of "Tre Trappor Upp" it's time for "Origo". On this new album Kaja still have their roots in Klezmer and other Eastern European folk music, but they've branched out and Origo even features influences from pop, West African music, jazz and electronica among others. A 12-minute long suite nestles with a deadly waltz, a dramatic unplanned road trip and breathtaking soundscapes. All with the cinematic chamber music sound of Kaja.

Ever since the very beginning in 2005, Kaja has boldly ventured out on an odyssey of traditions, making music with an element of surprise and a fully-loaded dynamic range. Kaja has released three albums of their own, in addition to "Midvintervaka", with Tetra. They have toured all over the world, worked with poets, artists, singer-songwriters, and also managed to find time to compose for the stage and the big screen. In 2015, Livet Nord was voted "Artist of the Year" at Sweden's Folk & World Music Awards.
